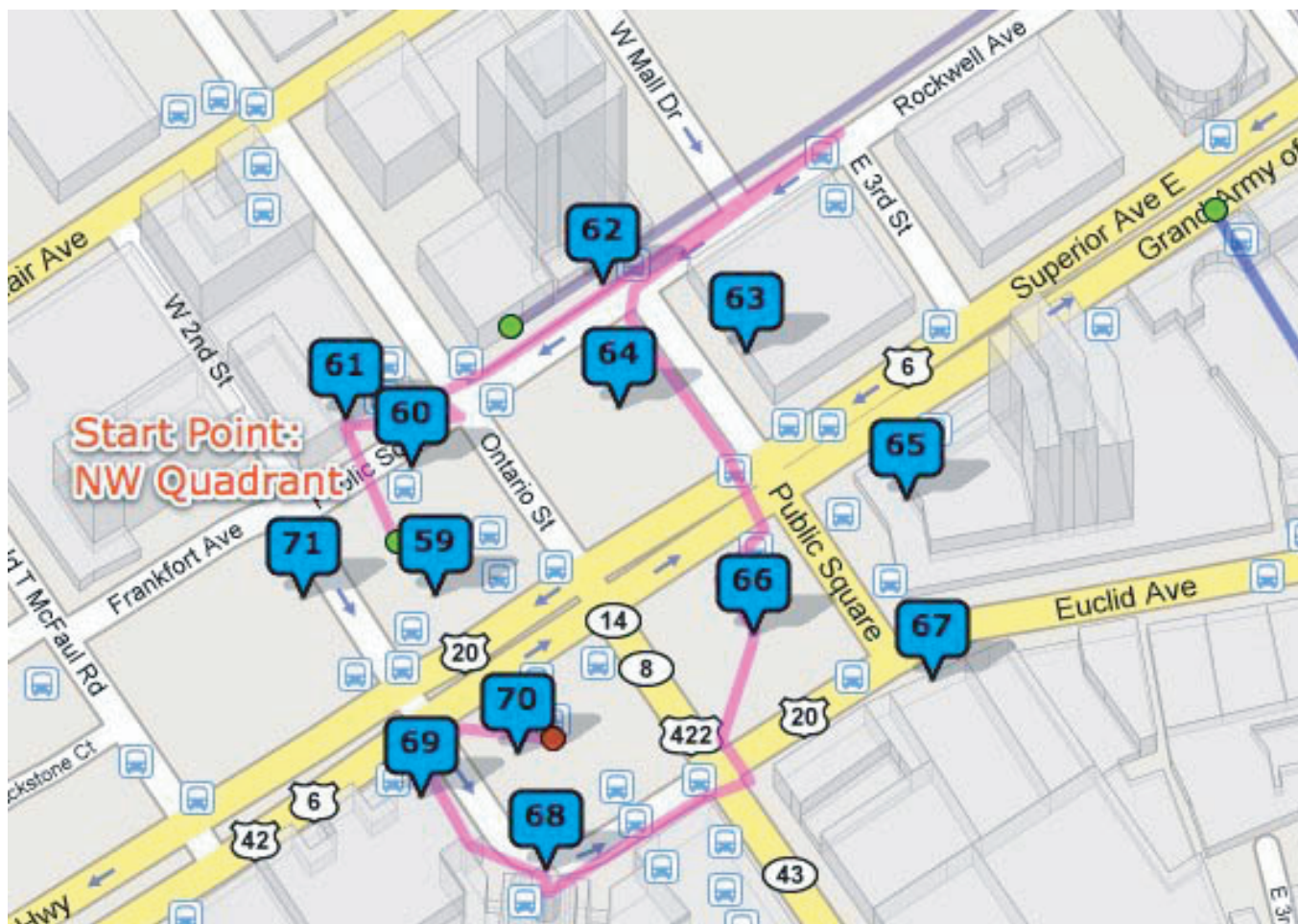




Public Square: “A Vision of a City with a Soul”

- 59. Starting Point of the prowl. Find a park bench!
- 60. Statue of Tom. L. Johnson, mayor of Cleveland from 1901 - 1909.
- 61. The Old Stone Church. Presbyterian church, the oldest building facing Public Square.
- 62. Key Corp. Center - Key Tower, Marriott Hotel and the Society for Savings.
- 63. The Howard Metzenbaum Federal Courthouse First building built of the Group Plan.
- 65. 200 Public Square, formerly the BP Building.

- 66. The Soldiers' and Sailors' Monument, built in 1894. Cleveland's major Civil War monument.
- 67. May Company Building, Once the largest department store in Ohio.
- 68. Terminal Tower, part of the Tower City Complex. Completed in 1927 as part of the van Sweringen Cleveland Union Terminal project.
- 69. The Renaissance Cleveland Hotel, occupying a site that has always housed a hotel since 1812.
- 70. Statue of Moses Cleaveland, father of the city.
- 71. Location of skyscraper proposed in 2008.
